BRAZOS RIVER AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTS OFFICERS

Waco, Texas (November 19, 2025) – At their regular meeting on November 17, 2025, the Brazos River Authority Board of Directors held elections for Board officers, naming Wesley Lloyd of Waco assistant presiding officer and R. Wayne Wilson of Bryan as secretary.

Wesley D. Lloyd of Waco was appointed to the Brazos River Authority Board of Directors in July 2016 by Governor Greg Abbott and reappointed to serve a full six-year term in 2019. He was elected by the Board of Directors in 2023 to serve as Board secretary, and on November 17, 2025, elected to serve as assistant presiding officer.

Mr. Lloyd is an attorney with Freeman Mills, PC of Waco, where he handles litigation and appeals primarily in disputes involving upstream oil and gas operations and midstream pipelines. Mr. Lloyd is board-certified in Oil, Gas & Mineral Law by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization and has considerable experience in water and environmental law. In 2011, he received the Young Lawyer of the Year Award from the McLennan County Bar Association. He has been named a “Rising Star” in Energy Law by Texas Monthly Magazine each year since 2012.

Mr. Lloyd is active in the community, serving in leadership positions for several different organizations. He also served for 8 years as Governor Perry’s appointee on two statewide boards responsible for leasing state land for oil and gas development.

Mr. Lloyd earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Texas A&M University and a Juris Doctorate from Texas Tech School of Law.

R. Wayne Wilson of Bryan was appointed to the BRA Board of Directors by Governor Greg Abbott in February 2019. He was reappointed to the Board in 2023.

Mr. Wilson owns and operates Wilson Cattle Company, a diversified stocker and cow-calf operation. He currently serves as chairman of the Brazos G Regional Water Planning Group and as a member of the board of directors of RVOS Farm Mutual Insurance Group of Companies. In addition, he served as former board chair of Aggieldand Pregnancy Outreach and as past director of the Brazos Valley Groundwater Conservation District and Capital Farm Credit, ACA. He has also served in various capacities on other local, county and state boards and committees.

Mr. Wilson is a member of the Texas & Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, Texas Cattle Feeders Association, National Cattleman’s Beef Association and National Rifle Association. Mr. Wilson married Linda Scasta in 1979. They have one daughter and three grandchildren.

The BRA’s 21-member Board of Directors, which meets bi-monthly, is appointed by the governor for a six-year term. While the BRAs presiding officer is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the governor, Board officers are elected by the Board itself to serve a two-year term.

About the Brazos River Authority

The Brazos River Authority, with headquarters in Waco, is the oldest river authority in Texas. Created by the Texas Legislature in 1929, the BRA’s 42,000 square-mile territory includes all or part of 70 counties, extending from the Texas-New Mexico border west of Lubbock to the Gulf of America near Freeport.

The BRA built, owns, and operates three reservoirs (Lakes Possum Kingdom, Granbury, and Limestone). In addition to these water supply reservoirs, the BRA contracts with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for water supply storage space at eight federal multi-purpose flood control and water conservation reservoirs (Lakes Whitney, Belton, Proctor, Somerville, Stillhouse Hollow, Granger, Georgetown and Aquilla).

The BRA operates a regional wastewater system for the cities of Temple-Belton. The BRA also operates wastewater treatment plants for the cities of Clute-Richwood, Sugar Land, and Hutto. The BRA operates a potable water treatment plant serving the city of Leander and owns and operates a regional system, the East Williamson County Regional Water System, for the City of Taylor.

The organization conducts water quality monitoring throughout the Brazos River Basin. As a member of the Texas Clean Rivers Program, the BRA samples and tests water from more than 100 locations throughout the basin on either a monthly,
