

Threats from USFWS Species Status Assessment

- Modified/Reduced Stream Flow
 - Reservoirs
 - Groundwater Pumping
 - Drought
- Water Quality
 - Wastewater Discharges
- Sedimentation
- Barriers to Fish Movement
- Climate Change





Why Federal permitting?

- ESA prohibits activities that affect listed species and their habitats
- Permit required for activities that may "take" threatened or endangered species
- Minimize exposure to ESA liabilities
- Minimize future impacts to BRA water supply operations





Contract Purpose

- Support BRA staff in negotiating permit with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services
- Support BRA staff in implementing permit terms and conditions

Pre-Listing Permit Development

- Duration: FY 2019 FY 2020
- Budget: \$950,000
- Pre-listing permit must be completed USFWS' final listing decision is effective



Contract Tasks

- Coordination with USFWS and other resource agencies
- Scoping of Permit
- Conduct future drought prediction scenarios
- Perform environmental flow standards analysis
- Develop a Habitat Quantification Tool

- Field Work to Support Permit
 - Occurrence surveys in areas not previously assessed
 - River cross-section surveys in areas where mussels occur
 - Flow-habitat data collection in areas where mussels occur
 - Occurrence surveys on other relevant aquatic species



Contract Tasks continued

- Draft Permit
 - Assessment of current conditions and future needs
 - Threat assessment
 - Development of conservation actions
 - Identify science needs
 - Development of success measurement tools
 - Develop an adaptive management strategy
 - Develop long-term monitoring program



Contract Tasks continued

- Operations/Business Plan
- Develop any necessary sampling or study plans
- Develop any Standard Operating Procedures necessary
- Assist BRA in obtaining Federal Scientific Collection Permit
- Assist BRA in amending existing Texas Parks and Wildlife Department scientific collection permit, if necessary
- Provide any necessary training for BRA staff



Contract Tasks continued

- USFWS staff has indicated that a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Assessment (EA) will need to be developed
 - Purpose and need for action
 - Identification of alternatives to the action
 - Analysis of environmental, social, and economic impacts
 - Determination if action will have significant impacts
 - Participate in public scoping meeting



Post-Listing Permit

- Only necessary if pre-listing permit cannot be obtained by the listing effective date.
- Larger, more time consuming permitting action
 - Requires development of Habitat Conservation Plan

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NEPA Environmental Impact Statement



Other Contract Terms

- Contemplates a long-term relationship may be necessary
 - Post-listing permit
 - Conservation measures
- Contract includes a negotiated rate structure
- No additional work will be authorized without approval of the Board of Directors.



Resolution

"BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the **Brazos River Authority hereby authorizes the** General Manager/CEO to enter into a contract with Bio-West, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$950,000 for endangered species permitting for freshwater mussels, developing all necessary associated documents, and assisting the Brazos River Authority with implementation of permit provisions."
