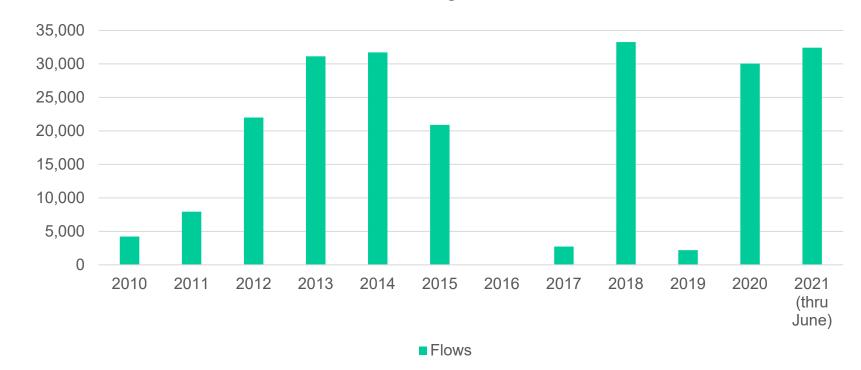


Cost Reimbursable Operations

- The Brazos River Authority operates the Williamson County Regional Raw Waterline under a cost reimbursable agreement with the Cities of Round Rock and Georgetown and the Brushy Creek Municipal Utility District.
- Each year, at the customers direction, the BRA prepares an operating budget based on transporting 25,000 AF of water from Lake Stillhouse Hollow to Lake Georgetown.
- The pipeline has transported more water than anticipated this fiscal year (32,426 AF through June 30, 2021) due to drier than normal conditions last fall and winter. This is causing electrical costs to operate the pumps to go over budget.
- The FY 21 Budget for electricity for the Williamson County Regional Raw Waterline needs to be increased from \$948,746 to \$1,548,746 (\$600,000) to provide adequate funds for transporting raw water.
