

# Candidate Conservation Agreement With Assurance (CCAA)

- Voluntary agreement with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)
- Provides net conservation benefit to Covered Species
- Allow for continued water supply development to meet the growing demands of an increasing population within the Brazos River basin
- Incidental take protection
- Regulatory assurance for no additional conservation measures if listed



#### Risk of No Agreement

- The Endangered Species Act (ESA) prohibits activities that affect listed species and their habitats
  - By covering our operations under a CCAA agreement with USFWS we minimize future impacts to BRA water supply operations
  - USFWS has disrupted state water rights systems in other states
- Permit required for activities that may "take" threatened or endangered species
  - Minimize exposure to ESA liabilities during conditions beyond our control
