The PHDI, which is a product of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, is an indicator for how wet or dry conditions are within a particular area. Due to the drier than normal conditions in the Lake Granbury, Whitney, Aquilla, and Limestone areas, the monthly PHDI is currently below the -2.4 trigger.
