


# Before You Go, Know:



Vertical stripes mark the middle of the channel: pass on either side



Possible rocks, construction, or stumps: proceed with caution



Protected swim area: keep out



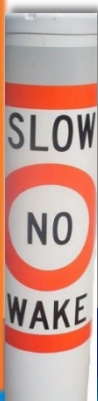
Crossed diamonds: areas off-limits to all vessels

## IN CASE OF EMERGENCY DIAL 9-1-1

- Do not operate above idle speed within 100 feet of any other vessel, person, stationary platform, other object, or shore
- Anyone born after Sept. 1, 1993 must have a boater's education certificate on them & a photo ID to operate a boat
- Have a Coast Guard-approved life jacket on board for each person
- Proceed at a safe speed to allow time to take proper and effective action to avoid collisions
- When two power-driven vessels are meeting "Head-on," alter the course to the right so each boat passes on the left side of the other

No Wake Zones are areas where boaters must slow to the point they do not generate a wave.

Boat operators are responsible for any damages caused by their wake, no matter if in a wake zone or not.
