The PHDI, which is a product of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, is an indicator for how wet or dry conditions are within a particular area. Due to the drier than normal conditions in the Brazos River basin, the monthly PHDI has dropped below the -2.4 trigger for the Possum Kingdom-Granbury-Whitney reservoir system, the Georgetown-Stillhouse Hollow reservoir system, and for Lakes Proctor, Aquilla, Belton, and Limestone.
