Re: Implementation of Stage 3 – Drought Emergency for Lake Proctor

Dear Mr. Sorrells:

The Brazos River Authority (BRA) informed you by letters of the declaration of a Stage 1 – Drought Watch for Lake Proctor on March 17, 2022, and a Stage 2 – Drought Warning on August 8, 2022. Drought conditions have continued, and the elevation of Lake Proctor has now dropped below its Stage 3 – Drought Emergency trigger of 1153.3 feet-msl. **As such, the BRA is implementing a Stage 3 – Drought Emergency condition for Lake Proctor.**

The stated goal of a Stage 3 – Drought Emergency in the BRA Drought Contingency Plan (Plan) is a twenty percent (20%) reduction in water use that would have occurred in the absence of any drought contingency measures. **We ask that you take action consistent with Stage 3 of the BRA Plan to achieve a twenty percent (20%) reduction in water use.**

BRA's Interruptible Water Sale Procedure and Plan allow the BRA to require that all interruptible water customers cease all diversion and use of water when a Stage 3 – Drought Emergency condition has been initiated for any reservoir. **Since we are initiating Stage 3 at Lake Proctor, we are requiring all interruptible water customers at Lake Proctor to cease diversion at this time.**

The BRA is monitoring water supply and drought conditions within the basin and will notify you when changes under the Plan are made or additional action is required.
