As specified in the Brazos River Authority (BRA) Drought Contingency Plan (Plan), one of the triggers for the Stage 2 – Drought Warning Condition for the East Williamson County Regional Water System (EWCRWS) at Lake Granger is when the total daily water consumption at the EWCRWS reaches ninety percent (90%) of the EWCRWS' production capacity for a period of 30 consecutive days. The EWCRWS reached this trigger during the latter part of August 2023. **Therefore, the BRA is implementing a Stage 2 – Drought Warning Condition for the EWCRWS.**
