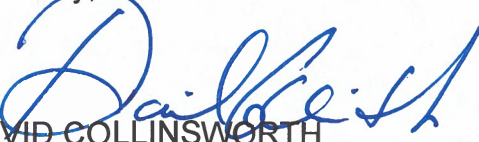
Your entity was notified of a Stage 2 - Drought Warning declaration for the East Williamson County Regional Water System (EWCRRS) at Lake Granger on August 21, 2024, as a result of the total daily water consumption at the EWCRRS reaching ninety percent (90%) of the EWCRRS' production capacity for a period of three consecutive days. As specified in the Brazos River Authority (BRA) Drought Contingency Plan (Plan), this is one of the triggering criteria for a Stage 2 - Drought Warning Condition at the EWCRRS.

Over the last few weeks, there has been a reduction in total daily water consumption from the EWCRRS plant. The reduced water consumption trend is expected to continue with the transition to fall, cooler weather, and recent rainfall.

Therefore, BRA is rescinding the Stage 2 - Drought Warning declaration for the EWCRRS. BRA will coordinate with you as necessary in accordance with the BRA's Plan as drought conditions change.

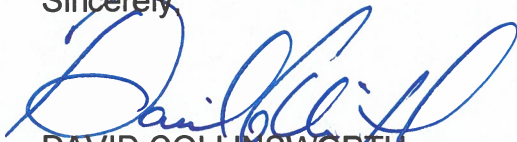
